Appleton

Appleton Yorkstone offers natural high slip resistance and strength, making it ideal for pedestrian and trafficked areas. Its blue/buff colouration ensures durability and hard-wearing performance. Commonly used for paving, kerbs, tactile surfaces, and bespoke masonry items.

Specification

Colour: Blue/Buff Yorkstone

Paving and masonry grade

Block weights: typically 2-12 tonne

Bed heights: varying



Doddington

Doddington is suitable for use in construction including internal/external flooring, paving, loadbearing masonry and cladding.

Specification

Colour: Unique and consistent pale pink / lilac colouration and fine grained in appearance

Walling and masonry grade

Block weights: typically 2-12 tonne

Bed heights: varying



Howley Park

Howley Park boasts the largest mineral reserve in West Yorkshire, offering a fine to medium grained sandstone, buff/grey in colour, suitable for paving, walling, masonry, carving.

Specification

Grey masonry grade block: Fine-to-medium grained Sandstone, predominantly grey, occasional rust markings

Buff walling and masonry grade: Fine-to-medium grained Sandstone, predominantly brown / buff with a slight tonal variation throughout

Block weights: typically 2-12 tonne

Bed heights: varying



Natural block stone collection

Fletcher Bank

Fletcher Bank Sandstone has a naturally occurring variable colour marbling gives a superior look to this large stone block which would be perfectly suited to creating steps or walling. It is a coarse-grained gritstone from the Carboniferous period Buff to grey in colour.

Specification

Colour: Traditionally buff/grey/blue in colour

Masonry grade: all Buff

Walling grade: buff/Grey/Blue (prone to grey hearts)

Block weights typically 2-12 tonne

Bed heights: varying



Locharbriggs

Locharbriggs is a renowned red sandstone and has been selected for many high-profile projects. Used for masonry, walling, traditional cladding and architectural features.

Specification

Colour: Red

Masonry and walling grade: Medium grained red/pink Sandstone (prone to black fleck inclusions)

Block weights: typically 2-12 tonne

Bed heights: varying



Stanton Moor

Stanton Moor is a fine-grained sandstone suitable for Ashlar, including internal flooring, external paving, cladding, as well as retaining walls and river defence.

Specification

Masonry and walling grade

Colour: Varies from yellow buff to hints of pink

Block weights: typically 2-12 tonne

Bed heights: varying

St Bees

St. Bees is suitable for domestic and commercial projects - masonry, walling, detailed carving, architectural features and traditional cladding.

Specification

Colour: Dark red / plum

Masonry and walling grade: Fine-to-medium grained Sandstone. Consistently textured, with occasional light and dark inclusions

Block weights: typically 2-12 tonne


Bed heights: varying

Basilica de la Sagrada Família

Client: Junta Constructora del Temple

Architect: Antonio Gaudí

Location: La Sagrada Família, Barcelona

Within the framework of the construction of the Basilica, we collaborate with the Construction Board of the Expiatory Temple of the Sagrada Família.

The challenge

La Sagrada Família is a World Heritage Site and Barcelona’s most visited landmark, attracting over three million visitors annually. Designed by Antoni Gaudí, construction began in 1882 and is expected to continue until around 2036. When Gaudí died in 1926, only a quarter of the building was complete, and sourcing suitable stone for the remaining work has become increasingly critical.

Contributing to a project of such cultural and architectural significance is a great honour for Dale View Quarry and Marshalls, with quality and consistency essential to meeting the demands of this iconic structure.

Our approach

Marshalls began supplying stone to the project in 2018, with cutting commencing in 2021. Buff sandstone from Dale View Quarry is supplied in block form, with all carving carried out by the masons and sculptors working directly on the basilica.

The stone was selected for its consistent colour, workable texture for hand carving, and resistance to frost and salt—key requirements for a structure of this scale and longevity.

The outcome

To date, approximately 2,000 tonnes of stone have been supplied, with further orders expected as construction progresses. Most of the stone will be used on the Glory Façade—the largest and final of the basilica’s three façades—symbolising humanity’s ascent to God.

It is humbling to know that stone from Dale View Quarry will form part of a monument admired by millions for generations to come. Marshalls is proud to support the ongoing creation of one of Europe’s most extraordinary architectural achievements.

Hollymount Farm

Client: Hollymount Property Developments

The challenge

The original Hollymount Farm had fallen into disrepair and was described as “slowly becoming an eyesore”. The brownfield site sits on a single-track lane within green belt farmland, making sensitivity to the local setting essential.

Any new development needed to reflect the rural architectural vernacular and integrate naturally with its surroundings, while improving access for residents.

Our approach

Locally sourced natural block stone and aggregates from Fletcher Bank Quarry in Ramsbottom provided an ideal solution. The quarry has supplied stone to the area since the late 19th century, with its material widely used across the local built environment.

The carboniferous sandstone combines strength with a warm, buff colour, making it well suited to high-quality new-build development that respects its setting.

By working with Fletcher Bank Quarry, Marshalls and local stone cutters, Hollymount Property Developments ensured the scheme met modern standards while blending seamlessly into the landscape.

The outcome

The planning application received strong support, with representations noting the development was in keeping with surrounding properties.

Planning permission was granted and construction is now underway, using locally sourced stone and aggregates. Short transport distances reduced carbon impact while supporting local industry and traditional stone-working skills.

Case study

Latitude red, Leeds

Architect: Allies and Morrison

Location: Latitude red, Leeds, LS1

Project summary

To construct an eight storey eye-catching office development close to Leeds City Centre. This major business development has been designed to provide headquarter office buildings which accommodate a variety of requirements designed to the highest standards. The build combines natural light and contemporary architecture to create a striking working environment.

Solution

Marshalls supplied Fletcher Bank Sandstone ashlar walling for the exterior facade of the building giving a high quality finish to the overall design. The stone was fixed off site into a specifically designed window frame system before being installed in sections directly onto the external elevation.

Stone description

A Permian sandstone from the Locharbriggs Quarry. A new red sandstone with technical properties ideal for rainscreen cladding, ashlar and masonry products.

Fletcher Bank is a distinctive fine to medium-grained sandstone from the Carboniferous-age Millstone Grit series, quarried at Fletcher Bank Quarry in Lancashire, England.

Fletcher Bank Brown sandstone is particularly striking when used on large scale cladding projects, maximizing a high quality natural blast of colour which glides effortlessly across an exterior structure.



Case study

Beith Street

Architect: Falconer Chester Hall

Location: Locharbriggs Quarry, Dumfries, -3.582448

Project summary

The £65m development consists of two 10-storey blocks designed to house 700 students. The bespoke fan-shaped radiused façade was engineered from Marshalls Locharbriggs sandstone, quarried from Dumfries and Galloway. The red to pink sandstone is used throughout Glasgow so was sourced for this project to ensure the building harmonises with the city's traditional architecture such as the Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum which is situated nearby.

Solution

Marshalls provided extra-large elongated portrait panels that were mechanically fixed to a rainscreen cladding system, creating an extraordinary contemporary effect. The plan size of the rainscreen panels was selected to accommodate the building's radial exterior with the thinner width seemingly curving around the impressive structure. Marshalls also provided coping units in the same Locharbriggs sandstone.

Stone description

A Permian sandstone from the Locharbriggs Quarry in Dumfries. A new red sandstone with technical properties ideal for rainscreen cladding, ashlar and masonry products.

Dumfries and Galloway, Scotland

A Permian sandstone from the Locharbriggs Quarry in Dumfries, Scotland, Locharbriggs is one of the oldest and largest actively worked red sandstone quarries in Scotland today. Extensive reserves are readily available. Quarried since the 18th century, this red to pink medium grained sandstone is widely specified across Scotland and England.

Adagio Hotel

Architect: Ilan Murray Architects (AMA)

Stone cutters: McAleer & Rushe

Quarry: Stanton Moor Quarry

Location: Adagio Hotel, Stanton, B5 6DR

Background

As part of the £200m development of Edinburgh's historic old town, a new Accor Adagio Aparthotel was commissioned. Overlooking the characterful Royal Mile, the exterior facade of the new building had to seamlessly integrate the old with the new.

Solution

The remarkable exterior features a contemporary sandstone facade that wraps around the building. The striking colouration of Stanton Moor sandstone features a buff base with brown and gold variations, matching closely with the materials used in the historic city.

Stone Description

The stone used is a Permian sandstone from the Locharbriggs Quarry. This red sandstone has technical properties ideal for rainscreen cladding, ashlar, and masonry products.

Stanton Moor Quarry in Derbyshire, England, provides a beautiful Carboniferous sandstone, widely used across the UK for various projects, from major prestigious city centre schemes to residential developments and private homes. Stanton Moor buff sandstone is also specified in Scotland on a regular basis, providing a suitable match to Scottish blonde sandstones which are no longer available.
